From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

Last Tuesday we celebrated a dinner of appreciation for 48 unsung heroes, the Sacristans. Two women in particular, Dr. Eileen Moore and Dr. Frances Andrews, are so talented and generous to God with their talents as they sew banners, altar cloths, and do the things that keep reminding us of the sacredness of God's house and the liturgical seasons.

The food for this banquet of appreciation was organized by Marcy Fleming (she also keeps the Sacristan's work schedule). The libations were shopped for by John Tombrello, former Head Sacristan, who still keeps a hand or two in sacristy work.

The above are one of several groups of "unsung heroes" in our parish. Servers, Lectors, Cantors, and Ushers are visibly seen doing the work of God, but those who work on Saturday mornings (Sacristans) are hardly seen. Five ladies come for 45 minutes and clean the altar, confessionals, sacristy, etc., and with 48 in number their turns come up every six weeks. Two other unsung heroes are Pat Spruill, who cleans the Chapel of Our Savior during her Monday, 3-5 a.m. adoration hour, and Walter Busenlehner, who cleans during his Thursday, 1 a.m. hour. They are seen only by the Lord at these early hours.

Bo Lovell, Head Sacristan, notices how some Sacristans bring their younger children to work on Saturdays and how the children are so happy to be involved in the cleaning of God's House.

Those white cloths we see next to the Chalice of consecrated wine are only used once. As we wipe the cups with those white cloths our theology tells us that the outside externals of "wine", now the precious Blood of Jesus, is present only as long as the accidents of wine

are visible as such, but not the stains. The stain on the purificators, which are almost like the ashes of a cremated body, are to be treated with reverence. During the week we use about 30 purificators, and on Sundays (every weekend) we use about 60. This is 60 purificators that are washed and ironed by that great group of women who slip into the sacristy and pick up the "sacred linens" and the other linens (for the priest washing his hands), wash, iron and return them for future use.

Being Head Sacristan and Plant Manager was really too much work for the hardworking John Tombrello. Bo Lovell, who is preparing for the seminary, was willing to take on the job of Head Sacristan. John T. used to say he could not do his job without Dr. Andrews. Seems like Edrie Andrews is in the sacristy working as much as the priests.

Other groups whom we just presume to always be "there" are also not appreciated enough: Ushers, Lectors, Servers and Extraordinary Ministers.

I trust God will reward, greatly, those above in the next life.
