From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

An issue of *Catholic Update* titled their feature topic "A Walk Through the Mass". They put the emphasis on the Mass as a meal, rather than as a sacrifice. The Meal is the people's consuming that which is first offered to God, the Father. The reason I am driven to write a small book on the Mass is simply because, somehow, in Catholic catechetics, we just don't seem to prioritize what the Mass is. Yet, the prayers of the Mass say it. The popes, Pius X and Pius XII, have said it, and, yes, even the first pope, St. Peter, references this fact, writing to all baptized people of his day that they are a royal priesthood. What else does this mean except that we share in the priesthood of Christ, and as St. Paul reminds us:

"As often as you do this, you proclaim His death until He comes."

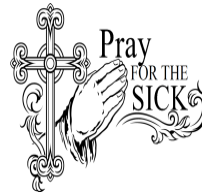
Paul does not say, primarily, "As often as you do this you sit down for a most holy meal." That's secondary and comes from God offering back to us what we have first offered to Him. Proclaiming His death is proclaiming His sacrifice and priestly offering to the Father. It seems a slight bit of Protestant theology has slipped into the way we catechize our people. They emphasize the "meal" aspect, and St. Peter called all baptized "a royal priesthood".

With present catechesis, it is like St. Peter never told all baptized in the first century that they were a "royal priesthood", as though popes have not written on the "priesthood of the Laity", as though we don't say "we offer you this life-giving Bread, this Chalice of Salvation" right after the consecration and after a moment of elevated Host, to affirm the real presence before the act of offering. The

priest does not say "I offer, but we offer you..."

Most of you have seen my favorite holy picture on the altar all during Lent. The original, much larger, is the masterpiece of art and theology by the artist, Stephen Ardovino (nephew of John Tombrello).
