From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

R.C.I.A. Class: We just had our third class, and though many come to accompany those interested, to help them get to know others, we do have 17 interested in the faith. The problem is we usually start with 20. This means we have three people, somewhere, who are called to come to the class and have not yet started.

Larry Johnson told me that he keeps inviting a friend who is close to coming, and he keeps telling him that it is never too late to start. Right! We keep a supply of the talks from day one. Someone can always "catch up" if they want the full course. There are those who come simply to educate themselves in Catholicism and/or to get closer to Jesus.

Last Monday night we dealt with Who is Jesus. He is not half God and half man. He is completely God and completely Man. He has a divine intellect and a divine will. He has a human intellect and human will. Mystery of Mysteries that God would look at His masterful creation and see us in trouble. We are made to His image and likeness: intellect, free will and eternity. With these three, we humans have not always made "good choices" in our relationship with our Creator.

Yes, we need an offering to the Almighty for the forgiveness of sin. That God would reveal the mystery of the Trinity and have the Son join Himself to our human nature in the person of Jesus of Nazareth and suffer for our sins is so extremely Biblical and so mysterious.

However, we need to let God be God. God has a right to His mysteries and we have an obligation to respect this right. When He reveals a "mystery" we are not to stamp our feet and insist on understanding. It is for us that we have Jesus of Nazareth dying for our sins. No wonder Pope Francis says that the

name of God is MERCY. This is born from His love for us.

Who is Jesus to us? He is our Savior, our redeemer, our God, and our closest friend. The Apostle St. Paul saw many similarities between loving Jesus and the way two people love one another in the married life. For St. Paul, faith in Jesus was a "relationship" with Jesus. Here are five aspects of St. Paul's love of Jesus:

1. LOVE IS A TWO WAY STREET. As St. John says, "God has loved us first." Yes, just as Charles loved Mary first and waited for a return of that love, which finally came, so, too, God loves first and waits for a return. You can never force someone to love you. You can reach out, as God does, and we are free to make the return. Paul writes that God knew him and reached out to him at birth, but the great reaching out was on Paul's road to Damascus, when the Lord threw him to the ground and said, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" Paul could have rejected Jesus, but with such a forceful invitation to have his blindness healed by listening to Jesus, He fell in love with Jesus.
2. LOVE GROWS OVER A PERIOD OF TIME. Paul had to be baptized and learn more about Jesus, then his love for Him grew. Love GROWS. This is true with humans, and so is our love for Jesus, if we let it to grow.
3. LOVE IS CONSTANTLY NEW. There are countless stories of people whose lives have changed because they have fallen in love. St. Paul writes about the new life "in Christ." Love allows us to see the world with new eyes.
4. THE NEW VALUE (the trump card). Love is a commitment that has a superior value. St. Paul speaks of being beaten, stoned, jailed and left for dead and endless sacrifices he made in life because Christ was his top value.

5. LOVE HAS AN OPENNESS TO THE FUTURE. When the main bread-winner is transferred, the loving spouse is "open to the future." This is also true with the expectation of raising a child. For Christ, Paul was open to the future, whatever it held for him. New cities, new converts, new opportunities, new persecutions, and the new journey into the next life to be with Jesus.

Are we willing to try this love affair with Jesus, accept those aspects of a true love affair?

From the bottom of our hearts we want to say:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

When I am tired, help me still to say:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

When I find it hard to forgive,
I only need to repeat:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

What trouble can shake me –
what suffering overcome me
if I can always repeat:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

For the joys You give me –
for the graces You shower on
me, my Thank You will always be:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

An simply to please You, for
no other reason, let me often say:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

And when the evening of my
life comes, and You invite me
home, let me say for one last
time here below, before I depart:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!

An when you call me for judgement,
be merciful, Lord, because You know
how many times I have said:

JESUS, I LOVE YOU!
