From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

Roger McLaughlin was at OLS for the Holy Sacrifice on the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows (Sept. 15, 2018). He wasn't feeling well, but he went anyway. After Mass his family took him to the emergency room. He had suffered a slight stroke. They eventually discovered an inoperative brain tumor, growing fast. Last week on the Feast of All Saints, the Lord took him to Himself.

I do not think it was an accident that, on the dawn of All Saints, Jesus placed another one on the roll of the saints in heaven.

It is with fond affection that I write about Roger, because we have known each other for 30 years. When I went to School Board meetings, Roger was the president of the School Board. In those days, someone prophetically told me that if I did not have a school foundation, I would not have a school in 20 years. People like John Kearney, Don Giardina and Patti Reid sold grapefruits and oranges on Greensprings to start the foundation. The school is now at an all-time high. However, it was Roger McLaughlin, who so wisely invested the foundation money of \$10 million in 25 years and made in excess of an extra \$12 million by wise investments.

Twice I said in public at school functions that, in honor of Roger, now that he has gone to his eternal reward, I will not approve a raise in the tuition as long as I am pastor. When I said this at a school Mass, parents began to pray for my longevity, and Mrs. Dorn turned to the P.T.O. president and said, "Well, I can start making out the budget for next year right now!"

For years Roger and I kept the purse strings tight on the school requests, and our great principal, for the past five years, has loosened those strings each year. On one occasion,

Mrs. Mary Jane Dorn gave me a ride to my doctor, and when she drove me back, as I was getting out of the car, she said, "Just a moment, please. I need more money from the School Foundation." When I narrated this to Roger, with his great sense of humor and a smile, he said to me, "The next time you need a ride to the doctor, let me take you!" But, he opened the strings to the purse anyway, and willingly.

Roger has five wonderful daughters and a dear wife of 52 years. She was in nursing school across from Notre Dame, and Roger, attending Notre Dame, made a choice pick. They both championed the Faith and Catholic schools. No wonder Roger was so involved and handled the foundation with such care.

Roger served his country for Jesus in the Marines. He then worked for 30 years for Bellsouth. He has also served on the diocesan finance committee. He was a familiar person at the 6:30 a.m. daily Mass, and was awarded the top service award by the Knights of Columbus this past 4th of July Festival. He received the Holy Anointing and the Papal Blessing less than 48 hours before his entry into heaven.

The School Foundation is now in the investing expertise hands of Mr. Joel Barlow. Most of us know Kara Barlow, his wife, a patroness of OLS School and John Carroll High.

November is the month the Church reminds us to pray for those who need our prayers, as they are in a state of purgation. In the Book of Job, God told the three "friends" of Job, who rashly judged him, that they would not be forgiven unless Job prayed for them. This is a great reminder that our prayers can help others. Do not forget to walk through the Columbarium and see familiar names, and offer that prayer, again, for those who might need our spiritual help.

Next week I will write on Fr. Underwood, who died at the age of 97, lingering those last years, and how Pope John Paul II made an offering at the age of 65 of those last years of

his life, in case his mind, in lingering, could not make that daily offering. It became a reality for him in his eighties.

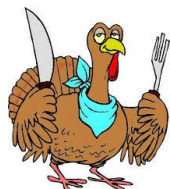
