From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

The well-publicized and attended mission entitled HOLY SPIRIT 101 amazed me. The number of attendees allowed was only 130. There are great plans for the future, and when Laney and Gary Gagnon report on the follow-up, I will pass it on in this weekly column. Let me say that it was only yesterday that I received another letter from a family in Trussville who came to this seminar on the Holy Spirit and are doing what they never did before: Praying together for 20 minutes every day.

While there seemed to be a limited number of places for Holy Spirit 101, there is no limit to the great mission starting Monday. Fr. Vernon Huguley is a great speaker and seems to be on the circuit of "giving parish missions."

Father Huguley's formula is unique. On Monday he starts with a talk, and with nine priests, we will then have our yearly Advent Penance Service. The second night, after the talk, he will anoint everyone with sickness. Father claims many of us are sick with stress these days and NEED the anointing. The third night, Father will offer the Holy Sacrifice, along with his mission message.

I encourage as many as can to make this Advent Mission. It is the first week of Advent, and Advent means penance, and penance means "getting closer to God." Life is short, and the single most important purpose of this short life is to strive to see how close we can get to our Creator, our Savior and our Sanctifier.

If you cannot make all the mission nights, at least try to attend some.

I did not advertise my birthday recently. However, I am most grateful to anyone who sent me greetings and happy wishes and the promise of prayers. I went into the Chapel of Our Savior yesterday morning, knelt down right in front, and looked up at Jesus in the monstrance, and I could hear Him say, "Do you know how many people are praying for your knee?" When I left shortly after, Antoinette Alfano leaned over and whispered, "How is your knee?"

Many blessings this season of Advent as we prepare to celebrate the birthday of Jesus, Who sends out so many extra blessings to so many in celebrating His own birthday.
