From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

**EPIPHANY:** In the past, we celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6, but because this is such a great feast and not everyone gets to Mass during the week for a great feast day, this feast is transferred to the Sunday closest to the 6<sup>th</sup> of January. BINGO – this Sunday is the 6<sup>th</sup> and the Feast of the Epiphany. Because of the greatness of the feast, there is an octave attached to it; for eight days the daily Masses are labeled individual days after the Epiphany.

Why is this feast so important to us? Salvation was promised first to the Jews. St. Paul writes to the Ephesians that he had a special revelation that, though it was not known in other generations, we gentiles are co-heirs, co-partners with the Jews in God's plan that we should have perfect happiness after this life. When the three wise men came from gentile territory by the invitation of God and the star, this was the Epiphany – manifestation of the Savior to the gentile world!

As we celebrate this feast, we emphasize God's **gift** to invite us along with the Israelites into heaven. Secondly, we look at the example of the wise men, coming from the gentile world, with their struggle traveling in danger and in hardship to come "to see Jesus." We take a lesson from them and know that to "see Jesus" is a struggle, and we too are willing to make the effort to "see our Savior" every day of our lives.

**NEW YEAR:** A holy, happy, healthy New Year to each of you. We have completed another year of our lives on this earth, and since the purpose of life is to glorify God, we thank Him for 2018, during which we had 365 days to praise and thank Him for the blessings, the opportunities and health this past year. We need to emphasize the blessings. Any sickness and financial setbacks pale in comparison to the blessings of receiving Jesus in the Eucharist and His promise of perfect happiness of heaven.

I told a lady last year how much I admired her because she had been a successful member of AA for two years. I said, "You have great will power." She said, "**I do not.**" That's why I joined AA. We make our resolutions not to drink and put it in the hands of God, telling Him how much help He has to give us weak-willed people." God and the fellow members of AA keep us sober.

Great idea! Let us keep identifying our resolutions and putting them in the hands of God for help.
