*From the Pastor's Desk*

My Dear People:

Advent: The most important aspect of our lives is our belief in a life after death. It is this life after death that ultimately shows us how much God loves us and makes sense of the suffering on this earth. In making us in His own image and likeness, He gave us "eternity," since He Himself has "eternity." Life on this earth is nothing less than a preparation for the next life, where God will shower His faithful with a happiness that cannot be humanly described.

The mysterious way of God is to hide that "life" from us while we are on this earth. We get small glimpses with apparitions of the saints, such as Our Lady appearing at Lourdes, the hot-bed of miracles, to verify the reality of that other life.

The existence of that "other life" was most manifested by Jesus, who died and who lives after death and was seen by over 500 of His followers, most notably the great persecutor of the Church, Saul of Tarsus, later named St. Paul. The reality of Paul's experiences caused him to turn 180 degrees and become the very kind of person that he persecuted. He suffered being stoned, beaten, imprisoned and, eventually, beheaded, because in the reality of that other life he would be with Jesus.

Most of us do not deny that "other life," but we simply do not act like we believe it 100 percent. During the season of Advent, we are reminded of the reality of that "other life."

We study Salvation History, which centers around the birth, life, and resurrection of Jesus. Advent is a time when we celebrate the fact that He has, indeed, been born.

The continuation of our life after death is based on the coming of our Savior. What is more important to us than that? Our Savior has said:

"I go to prepare a place for you, and I will come again to take you to Myself so that where I am, you, also, will be." (John 14:2-4)

"Everyone who believes in the Son has eternal life." (John 14:2-3)

We need a birthday gift for the Lord. It will depend on our own choice of the gift to Him. What amazes me is that on the Lord's birthday, He, Himself, gives people so many gifts: the grace to pray more, to be more faithful to the Holy Sacrifice, though with the pandemic, in so many cases, it is more through streaming the "Mass" into our homes during Advent that we pray this great prayer more.

The Nativity Scenes are the great reminders of the circumstances and of the reality of the birth of the Savior. I love the scene in front of the church. Many thanks to Joe Alesce, Greg Wos, John Tombrello, Paul DiGiorgio, Mary Rupinski, Jeannie Wade and Mike Millican for all the help in the construction and arranging of the stable, images, and lights. The Deering family constructed the same size scene on the highway in front of my farm in Chelsea, and I love it! Shouldn't there be a nativity scene in every home? We even have a scene in the Church Office.

The old Gorrie-Regan building property is now moving ahead. We begged for prayers for the vote on November 30, and our people have responded. The vote this past Monday night was 8 to 1 in favor of the approval of the Homewood City Council that we may build a parking area there for more parking places closer to the church building.

I was present at the meeting, and I must commend Charles Ferlisi, who was in charge of the whole operation, though he had professionals standing with him (attorney,

landscape architect, etc.). I also must commend two who came forth from those attending to verbalize on OLS's behalf: Rich Campbell and Tim Lucy spoke strongly on our behalf during this hour-long discussion. Some wheels turn slowly, and land development is one of them. THANK YOU, LORD, FOR THE PEOPLE WHO PRAYED FOR THIS AND FOR YOUR WONDERFUL ANSWER TO OUR PRAYERS.
