From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

So many thanks to those who turned in their tithing cards. The others of the parish were either out of town, still thinking, not quite sure what their earnings will be, or never checked the mail or missed the sermon on God's Plan to Support His Church. If you have lost your tithing card, call the office.

If we need \$2 million to operate the parish, and the pledges so far are \$1.5 million, we simply need another \$500,000 to operate. So, if you did not turn in a card, please turn in your card with your disposition. If you are unemployed, say so, etc. With 1500 families registered, there are 1200 pledges missing.

We need to give to God more than God needs our money, and God arranged it that He does need our money to keep our parishes alive and successful. Church law states that everyone must belong to a parish and give to the support of this parish. More importantly, the mind of God is that we give the first part of what we earn to Him. He owns everything we say is "ours."

Please send in your card and your intention to give to God through your parish. Even if your amount is small, the offering to God through the parish shows that you belong to the parish.

Merry Christmas! We can never get far from the glorious reality that the God of all the million planets and stars chose to come to small little earth, where He has creatures made to His own image and likeness to be with us, suffer with us, die for our salvation, and offers us unbelievable love. When the Savior came, He split our history in two.

We only have a few days left to get something for His birthday. The Advent wreath is the

time clock reminding us that we are so close to the day of celebration of His birth, five more days.

The Church uses three great Biblical characters to inspire us to celebrate His birthday:

- 1.) <u>Isaiah</u>, with so many prophecies concerning the Savior;
- 2.) <u>John the Baptist</u>, who prepared others for the coming of Christ, and;
- 3.) Lastly, <u>Mary</u>, who prepared for His birth and continues to point us in the direction of her Son.

Busy as the time is, we would be so wrong to forget the reason for all the celebration. We need to stop and imagine what it would be like if Jesus did not come. Could anyone of us survive before God without the mercy brought by Jesus? Could we be inspired to live for God if Jesus did not come? What kind of worship could we give the Father without Jesus? Lord Jesus come! Let us relive the time of expectancy. Let us plead and cry for the Savior as we renew our recognition of His coming by celebrating His birthday. Let every gift be given in His name. Let every heart rejoice and praise His goodness.

With 456 references to the Messiah in the Old Testament, people at the time of Christ were waiting, anticipating, and expecting someone great. He turned out to be far greater than they expected. God Himself decided to be our Savior, joining Himself to our human nature, in the person of Jesus of Nazareth.

If we had X-ray vision of our inner selves to see a scale of love on one side and selfishness on the other side, we might be shocked. Even though we love so much, most of us would be shocked at the amount of selfishness in our lives. Selfishness is another way to describe sin. In all reality we absolutely need the Savior.

We talk unkindly of others.

We use modern technology for evil, as well as good.

We are jealous, possessive, self-indulgent.


We are weak in faith and trust and even in love.
