From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

A blessed Christmas to each one of you.

On a birthday, we usually give gifts to the one whose birthday we celebrate; and we all, hopefully, have a gift for Jesus. But on **this** birthday, the honoree **gives** so many gifts of grace. He gives people the extra grace to worship Him in church when they usually don't, or in these days, to make an act of the will to watch the Mass live streamed on television. The Scriptures say that we cannot even pray without His help. So, He gives people extra grace on His birthday to pray, to reach out to others with kindness, to visit one another and to speak to that relative to whom we would rather not be speaking.

The greatest gift Jesus gives to us is His coming into the world. We all came into the world to live; He came into the world to die so that we might live in heaven for eternity.

God has a way of hiding Himself. He hid Himself as a human infant in Bethlehem. Then, as an adult, His divinity is revealed with His miracle at the wedding feast of Cana, the curing of the blind, the deaf, the crippled, and bringing the dead back to life. Jesus then claimed to be God as He said, "Before Abraham (2000 B.C.) came to be, I am." With this, God was no longer completely hidden.

The God in Him was revealed as He came forth from the grave.

The Christian life is a life which cannot be lived unless Christ exists with His divine grace given to us. So, the hidden God is also seen in people who live the faith.

The effects of the birth of the Savior in our lives should be fourfold:

1. PRAISE: We praise Him for His goodness to us. The Angels, in coming to the shepherds to announce this birth, sang: GLORY TO GOD IN THE HIGHEST. We need to do the same.
2. REJOICE: We rejoice that we have a Savior, for who of us can say we don't need the forgiving power of God, saving us through the work of Jesus.

"Rejoice always, Again,
I say 'rejoice'" (Philippians).
3. GIVE THANKS: It is one thing to rejoice; but it is just as important to go back and not just see what has been done for us...but to thank Him for doing this (P.S. Don't forget the tithing card).
4. IMITATE: Just as Jesus has given so much to us, we need to find ways to give to other people. That is the reason for all the gift-giving at Christmas; let us do it in His name. Let us not forget the reason for the season.

When we approach a Nativity scene, we need to say: "Praise to You, God. I am so happy you came to save us. Thank you, a thousand times. Help me to do things for others, as you have taught us to do, by your life, death and resurrection."
