From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

The outside Stations of the Cross are a great idea. We moved them so that people who walk to the front of the church on the Family Life Center side could pick up a spiritual thought as they walked up the hill to the front door of the church.

Because the pictures of the stations were not that attractive, I changed the pictures. The following is a human-interest story on the stations that I wanted in the first place.

The station pictures were given to me by Mary Claire Brouillette, and I have had many different copies made, because they photograph so well with the bright colors. These stations have a great history.

After the 2nd World War, there were American military bases in Germany. Mary Claire Brouillette's sister, Judy, taught English to the American military base children for years there. When the chapel was to be dismantled, along with the rest of the base, Judy asked the chaplain to give her the Stations of the Cross. The chaplain said that it was military orders not to give anything away, but she could follow him to the dump and pick them up from there. Judy went to the dump and brought these stations back to the States and gave them to her sister, Mary Claire, who gave them to me.

The colors are rich, and the pictures are graphic. I made several copies here in the office of different sizes and always planned to use them for the long-time dream of outside stations. I also have a copy of all 14 stations on the trees on the farm, like the wayside shrines I used to find in Europe when I walked some of the back roads in Italy.

If you study these stations, it will bring to mind that the bright white garment that Jesus is wearing in all scenes, up to the crucifixion, is the outstanding color of the various other colors in the pictures.

The Jewish High Priests wore a seamless garment when they went into the temple's most holy place to offer incense. The Scriptures tell us that Jesus' garments were divided among the soldiers who executed Him, and they threw lots for the seamless garment Jesus was wearing to His place of offering of Himself on the hill of Calvary. The stations remind us, with that outstanding white garment, that Jesus was a High Priest. After His scourging, they redressed Jesus in this white garment until His actual execution.

Maybe we can't make all the stations, but as we walk from the parking deck to the Chapel of Our Savior, we might look on one station and meditate on it.

We all have built-in penances, and one of mine is "double vision." Yes, after the successful surgery saving the eyesight from glaucoma, it resulted in "double vision," as the composite of the two eyes become two images in the brain.

In other words, as I reach for a glass of water, there are two glasses and there is the possibility as I reach for one, I turn the one with the water over, since it was the one in reality. When John Carney reads this, I might get disinvited to the reception at The Club after his daughter's wedding. I don't wish "double vision" on anyone for a built-in penance. We can always ask God for a different penance.

I thank all who prayed for my eyesight, since I found what I think is one of only two doctors around who operate on this issue on adults. It is the great providence of God that I connected. Surgery is on May 28, with an 85% success rate. Once again, God listens to every prayer. This Catholic surgeon was going to study urology when she knew the scarcity of ophthalmologists in this field of

double vision for adults, so she changed courses, and for this I thank God. May we all grow a little closer to God during this holy season of Lent.

A special "thank you" to the 16 teenagers who participated in our service retreat last Saturday. Food for Our Journey was so appreciative of your time and selfless service!

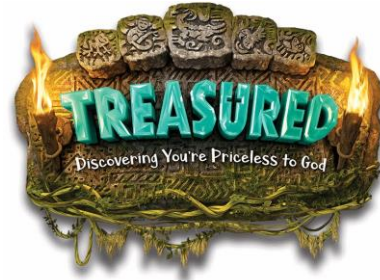
EDGE Middle School

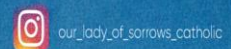
