From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People:

RELATIONSHIPS: There is an old saying about friendships and friends that are not of equal standing. The saying goes like this:

Friends are not always found among equals, but it makes equals of those it finds.

I better repeat this:

Friends are not always found among equals, but it makes equals of those it finds.

This is true in human relationships, even though Jesus said: "I call you not servants, but friends." Still, it does not make us equal to God. When we pray to God, we may be "friends," but we are not equals. We go to Him as BEGGARS.

After reading this concept of always being the beggar, I lost my keys and told God I was a beggar and was begging for help from the All-Powerful God. I then found the keys in one of my twin jackets "under the bed."

We should live our lives fearing the power of God. We cannot take His love, throw it back in His face, and say thanks, but no thanks. We cannot make a fool out of God or He would not be God.

We start our prayers knowing that He owes us nothing, and we come to Him as beggars, not with an entitlement attitude.

St. Catherine of Siena used to hear Jesus talking to her. The fact was, some of her apparitions were real and some, because of her very close relationship with Jesus and her mind working overtime, were said, by writers of the saints, to be imagined.

In her writings she thought Jesus said this to her:

"Do you not know, dear daughter, who you are and who I am? If you will know these two things, you will be blessed. You are the one who is not, while I am He who is."

Here is what Catherine learned: When we enter into prayer with God, God does not need us, and God does not need anything from us. God comes to us, even though we owe God everything.

Think of the parable of the tax collector: The pharisee goes into the temple to pray and tells God how good he is. The second man, a tax collector, only says: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus taught that the man in the back had the realization of God being God and himself a member of a sinful human race. Did he fear God? The implication was "yes," and he was sorry for his offenses and saw God so far above him.

The Scriptures talk about fearing the Lord:

Jonah: "The more knowledge of God you have, the more you fear Him."

I Deuteronomy: "Fear the Lord and acknowledge His power over you."

Jeremiah, telling the people of their evil ways: "You have forsaken the Lord your God and the fear of the Lord is not in you; none of you has the fear of the Lord in you."

Jesus says to us: "I call you not servants, but friends." This is the goodness of God's overture to us, but in objective reality this does not make us equals with God, because God's love for us is a mystery, which we need to stand back and respect. Still, we approach God as a friend, but not equal to Him. So, in our prayer life we need to approach God as beggars. He owes us absolutely nothing, and we come begging to Him for everything we need and want.

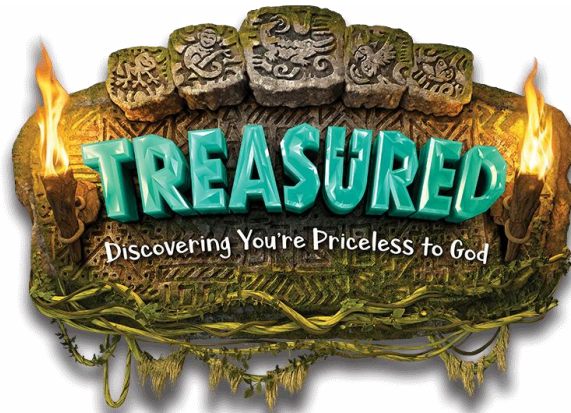
***All families are invited
