From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear People,

The Vacation Bible School this year was a "great success," in spite of Covid, says Suzanne Corso, PSR Director. She and everyone else is grateful to the 24 ADULT HELPERS and the 60 STUDENT HELPERS.

VBS simply could not happen without the volunteer helpers (84). When I looked in the Parish Hall to "see the action," Mrs. Cindy Rogers gave me needed information, and as she left at dismissal, she stated how much she enjoyed and loved working with those young people.

There were almost 100 children who spent the week on the <u>main theme</u> of the session, which was <u>each one of us is priceless to God</u>. He <u>loves</u> each one of us so much.

Many, many, and many thanks for all the prayers and sympathy notes to me on my recent eye surgery. I am giving the following update only because so many ask me individually and I thought I could give the one answer to all.

<u>Dr. Frank LaRussa</u> recommended a doctor at the Callahan Eye Foundation who performed a successful surgery by drilling a hole in the back of the eye to let out the pressure, which was killing the eye itself (Glaucoma). The surgeon warned me about the good chance of having double vision as a result, and that would take another corrective surgery.

To find a surgeon who will operate on an adult double vision problem is very difficult. We found Dr. Ann Marie Arciniegas, and she warned me ahead of time of the success rate, since this is an operation on the muscle on the inside of the eye, which was moved with the previous surgery.

Dr. Ann Marie operated 10 days ago, and I still have very distracting "double vision," which means I see the church is very full these days.

This past week I had another wonderful session with the surgeon who said that I should give the healing more time and the double vision may go away. This is difficult for me since I am not a good patient and having been called "Fr. Grump" a few times, I am trying more for the virtue of patience.

I was extremely excited that the surgeon said if the double vision does not heal itself after this surgery, she is willing to "fix it with another surgery." This pleased me greatly, along with her patience and kindness and drive to bring this sick eye to a successful conclusion. The right eye is perfect, but since I cannot wear a patch because the left eye has to work, it distorts the composite of both eyes in my brain. Since I have a mandate by the surgeon to take several weeks of rest, I will break the no vacation tradition and be on vacation for three weeks.

I am so grateful to the hardworking Fr. Frankline and those two wonderful priests from Holy Family who made the extra effort to "cover for me." I am most grateful to all who have prayed and continue to pray for that left eye. After this last week of extreme optimism on the part of the surgeon, I am grateful to God and to the surgeon, who predicts an ultimate success.

Please keep praying for a self-fix or another surgery, which promises to repair the present problem. This is microsurgery at its best and has its own percentage of not healing as fast as one would like.

Again, thanks for your patience and prayers.
